INTERLOCAL COOPERATION CONTRACT
FOR
PAVING SERVICES AT PROJECT BARN
BETWEEN SOMERVELL COUNTY
and
GLEN ROSE INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between the COUNTY OF SOMERVELL, hereinafter referred to as "County" and the GLEN ROSE INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT, hereinafter referred to as "School District", pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code entitled "Interlocal Cooperation Contracts".

RECITALS

WHEREAS, County has the equipment, materials and manpower necessary for road and parking lot paving; and

WHEREAS, School District is in need of a certain amount of parking lot paving at the School District's "Project Barn" near the County's Transfer Station in Somervell County, Texas; and

WHEREAS, the County is willing and able to provide those paving services to School District; and

WHEREAS, County and School District wish to make provisions setting out the rights and obligations of each of the parties hereto in connection with such an agreement.

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants and conditions contained herein, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, County and School District hereby agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

1. **Purpose of Agreement and Authority:** County and School District have determined that it is in the public interest of the residents living within the jurisdiction of County and School District that the following interlocal agreement be made and entered into wherein, County will provide paving services to School District at the School District's "Project Barn" near the County's Transfer Station in Somervell County, Texas.
2. **Term:** The term of this Agreement shall begin upon the approval of this Agreement by both County and School District and shall continue for a period of three (3) months from that date, or until the area around the School District's "Project Barn" near the County's Transfer Station in Somervell County, Texas have been paved by County.

3. **Services to be Provided by County:** County agrees to provide the equipment, manpower and materials necessary to pave the area immediately around the School District's "Project Barn" near the County's Transfer Station in Somervell County, Texas. The area to be paved is approximately Twenty feet (20') by 3/10ths mile in size. County will not be required to place any base material on the area, but shall only "chip seal" the surface of this area.

4. **Payment to be Made by School District:** School District agrees, in exchange for County's performance under this Agreement, to pay County upon receipt of an invoice therefor, the total cost of materials used, and manpower (at the rate of \$15.00 per man hour) used by County in its performance under this Agreement.






Not to sound negative, but August was, as we all know, hot and dry. Anyway, we played over 2600 rounds with green and cart fees a little over \$57,000.


Subject: August 2011 Monthly Report

Attached is the Monthly Report for August. The numbers for the month are down primarily due to the absence of Land of the Dinosaurs at the Amphitheatre. Discussion of that and other topics follows.

1. Attendance for the month and year are down primarily due to the loss of the play Land of the Dinosaurs at the Amphitheatre. August for the play was by far the best-attended month and that accounts for the disparity. The play, Land of the Dinosaurs, has regrouped with new investors and is planning a short season next June in the Amphitheatre. Hopefully, this will help the production catch on and get new life.
2. A new horse show, Ultimate Calf Roping, was held as a warm-up for their finals scheduled for the Expo Center September 29-October 2. This new event is a different kind of roping and has developed a following different from the traditional steer roping events that occur 5 to 6 times a year in our venue.
3. Attendance is down for the year due to Land of the Dinosaurs and working horse shows that are all down slightly. My staff is helping to formalize a marketing effort aimed at breed shows, like quarter horses, paints, miniatures, etc., with the intent to shift into a different genre of horse show.



